The Center for Disabilities and Development (CDD) is dedicated to improving the health and independence of people with disabilities and creating a life with opportunities for everyone. Designated as Iowa's University Center for Excellence on Developmental Disabilities since 1972, we are an interdisciplinary center that integrates a broad array of clinical services in one location, providing an ideal environment for exceptional patient care, education, and research. The CDD is also home to Iowa's Leadership Education in Neurodevelopmental and Related Disabilities (LEND) program and has provided outstanding interdisciplinary training since 1993.

Our clinical team works with patients with attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, autism spectrum disorder, behavior disorders, cerebral palsy, cognitive disorders, Down syndrome, Fragile X and spina bifida.
